## **Programs & Services**

#### **Shelters**

**Men's Sleeping Room:** 2015 marked the 19th season for the Men's Sleeping Room program. This ministry continues to provide a safe, warm place for single men each evening we are open. An evening meal, breakfast, shower, clean bed, clean clothes, and fellowship are the hallmarks of this program.

**Family Shelter:** Our family shelters consist of two efficiency apartments and four rooms that share the kitchen/living space and bathroom.

#### Food

Our Food Pantry is open four mornings a week and provide emergency food to others when we can. We continue to have people coming to the Food Pantry for the first time.

**Other Pantries:** We work with High Street United Methodist Church and Grace Lutheran Church to provide vouchers to clients for their food pantries.

**Food Drives:** Christian Ministries accepts food donations at anytime during office hours. We do hold and/or participate in the following Food Drives:

- ◆ Stuff-A-Bus—spring and fall
- ♦ Letter Carriers Food Drive—May
- ♦ Thanks-Singing Festival Food Drive—November

### **Outreach Services**

### **Emergency Assistance**

**Rent and Utilities:** Christian Ministries helps people with their rent and/or utilities one time per year. We work with a number of churches and individuals to provide matching funds that allow us to do as much as we can for those in need. We also connect clients to other agencies that provide rent and utility assistance.

**Baby Care:** We provide diapers, baby wipes, baby formula and baby food to families that need help with these basic baby items. We also provide some clothing for newborns. We work with other agencies to help clients get the items they need for their new little ones.

**Blanket Cupboard:** We provide blankets, sheets, pillows and pillowcases, towels, and washcloths for people without these items. This ministry is housed at Holy Trinity Lutheran Church and is open Wednesday afternoons during the school year.

Mary Jane Luick Trust Committee: This group assists elderly and disabled indigent women in Delaware County with a variety of unusual needs that are not met through existing community resources.

**Festivals:** Christian Ministries unites the diverse faith communities three times each year: in the spring with the Wednesday Lenten Services and lunch; with the Community Good Friday Service; and the Thanks-Singing Festival. In 2015 The Lenten Services were held at Unitarian Universalist, the Good Friday Service was at First Baptist Church, and the Thanks-Singing Festival was at High Street United Methodist.

**Treasure Shop:** The Treasure Shop is our organization's fundraiser used to augment the work of Christian Ministries. The shop also serves as a place for clients who qualify to receive free clothing and household items, free through referral.

**Fresh Start:** This program provides furniture and household items for our clients as they move out of our homeless shelters. Depending on donations, clients may receive free beds, dressers, tables, chairs, couches, lamps, dishes, pots and pans, silverware and linens.
